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TCA has two items to report :

1. Consolidated Response to Review Comments on WS202 1v6.0 :

- (1) Thank you for your comments on T glyph, in which three radical parts ("乚", "𠃉?" and "++") are suggested to be normalized, the normalization principle of TCA only applies to educational characters (T1, T2), except that the literary forms are conformed to the original characters as much as possible. the name characters must comply with the glyphs in the government household register. This issue has been mentioned many times, and the description of TCA can be found in [IRGN 2347](#), [IRGN2546](#)Part 4.
- (2) When submitting the WS2024 character set, TCA will try it best to select forms that follow Taiwan regional conventions.

2. WS2024 character set

For the WS2024 character set, TCA will submit 1,000 characters from the following sources :

- **Personal names** : Sources include Dept. of Household Registration, M.O.I. (Ministry of the Interior), and National Government (pre-1948) personnel survey forms from Academia Historica;
- **Minnan/Hakka characters**: Sources include the Ministry of Education's Reference List of Native Language Characters and 吳守禮(Wu Shouli)'s Dictionary of Taiwanese Characters 《國臺對照活用辭典》;
- **Place names**: Old place names used in the early days of Taiwan; sources include the information provided by the Department of Land Administration, MOI.

- **Daoist characters:** The Academician Fong-Mao Lee (李豐楙), Taoist priest and his team compiled a list of common or regularly used Daoist characters. These characters mainly come from 道法會元(Dao-Fa Hui-Yuan).

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
